Tidioute Community Charter School to be host to the Pennsylvania State Tournament of the National Science Decathlon

The Tidioute Community long known for being the home of the Pennsylvania State Championship Fishing Tournament now has another exciting opportunity to be known not only on a state but national level as well. The Tidioute Community Charter School will be the site of the Pennsylvania State Tournament of the National Science Decathlon on Saturday November 17th, 2007.

The National Science Decathlon, a nonprofit organization dedicated to promoting science education through competitive hands tournaments, is the fastest growing science competition program of its nature in the United States. Each decathlon tournament is made up of ten team events and up to four pilot events. Some of the events include Bridge Breaking, Ick!thyology (the study of fish), Mousetrap Cars, Cranefly: Rubber Powered Airplanes and Robotics just to name a few. Division A events are for 9th -12th grade high school students and division B events are for 6th -9th grade junior high, middle school and intermediate elementary students. Teams from the Northeast Conference which includes Connecticut. Maine. Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island and Vermont are invited to participate in the tournament. Teams qualifying on the state level will then have the opportunity to travel to the University of Bridgeport in Connecticut to participate in the Northeast Conference Tournament in February. The top three teams at that conference will then qualify to move on to the National Science Decathlon to be held at Duke University in North Carolina on April 12, 2008.

Tim McDowell, a science teacher at TCCS and winner of the 2005 Educator of the Year Award from the Warren County Conservation District is the director of the science decathlon. TCCS is currently looking for sponsors for the decathlon

to cover some of the operating costs including registration fees and to sponsor individual teams.

The National Science Decathlon offers small/rural schools, new teams, church teams, home school teams and neighborhood groups an economic opportunity to be formally recognized and rewarded for their achievements and successes as they relate to science education. College Information

Senior year can be intimidating for many students and parents. If your student is considering college after high school, it may be difficult to know where to start. Here is a helpful guide for parents and students alike. September: If your student has not already taken college entrance exams, either the SAT or the ACT, now is the time to register for a fall examination date. Online registration is the easiest method for both the SAT at www.collegeboard.com and ACT at www.act.org, however, paper registration forms are available in the office. Start looking for scholarships with internet searches available at www.collegeboard.com or www.fastweb.com. Remember, you should never have to pay fees or provide credit card numbers to search for scholarship information. Your student should be researching different college programs and options, some colleges have early admission deadlines of November: be certain to know when your child's prospective university's deadlines for admission applications are.

Juniors should also be looking into different universities, tech schools, colleges, and employment as now is the time to start exploring prospective careers. Resources are available in the office for students to explore careers; interest inventories, occupational outlooks, and the ASVAB are a few resources available to our students for careers. The ASVAB will be

administered in November for the eleventh grade. While it gets a bad rap as a military recruiting source, the ASVAB is an excellent tool for students to explore career aptitudes and interests if the test is taken seriously.

TCCS Library Offers Extended Hours and More Choices

The library committee has been hard at work all summer to make improvements to the library program. A reminder that the TCCS library is offering extended hours to students. The library is open every Wednesday until 4pm. The library is also open the third Saturday of every month from 9:30 to 11:30 am for students to check out books, study or do research. The monthly story hour program begins at 9:45. This month we did Curious George, next month is Halloween themed.

This includes but is not limited to; room parents, field trip chaperones, expeditionary project volunteers or any event where volunteers will be working with the children.

We strongly encourage each family to make a commitment to contribute a minimum of 10 hours a year to the school by volunteering in one or more areas of the school's operation. You are not expected to serve at each of the events a particular committee will sponsor, but help as your schedule permits. Your involvement in special events is equally important to that of the daily or weekly volunteer because these projects could not be completed without your help.
